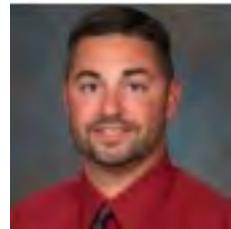


A Message From The Principal

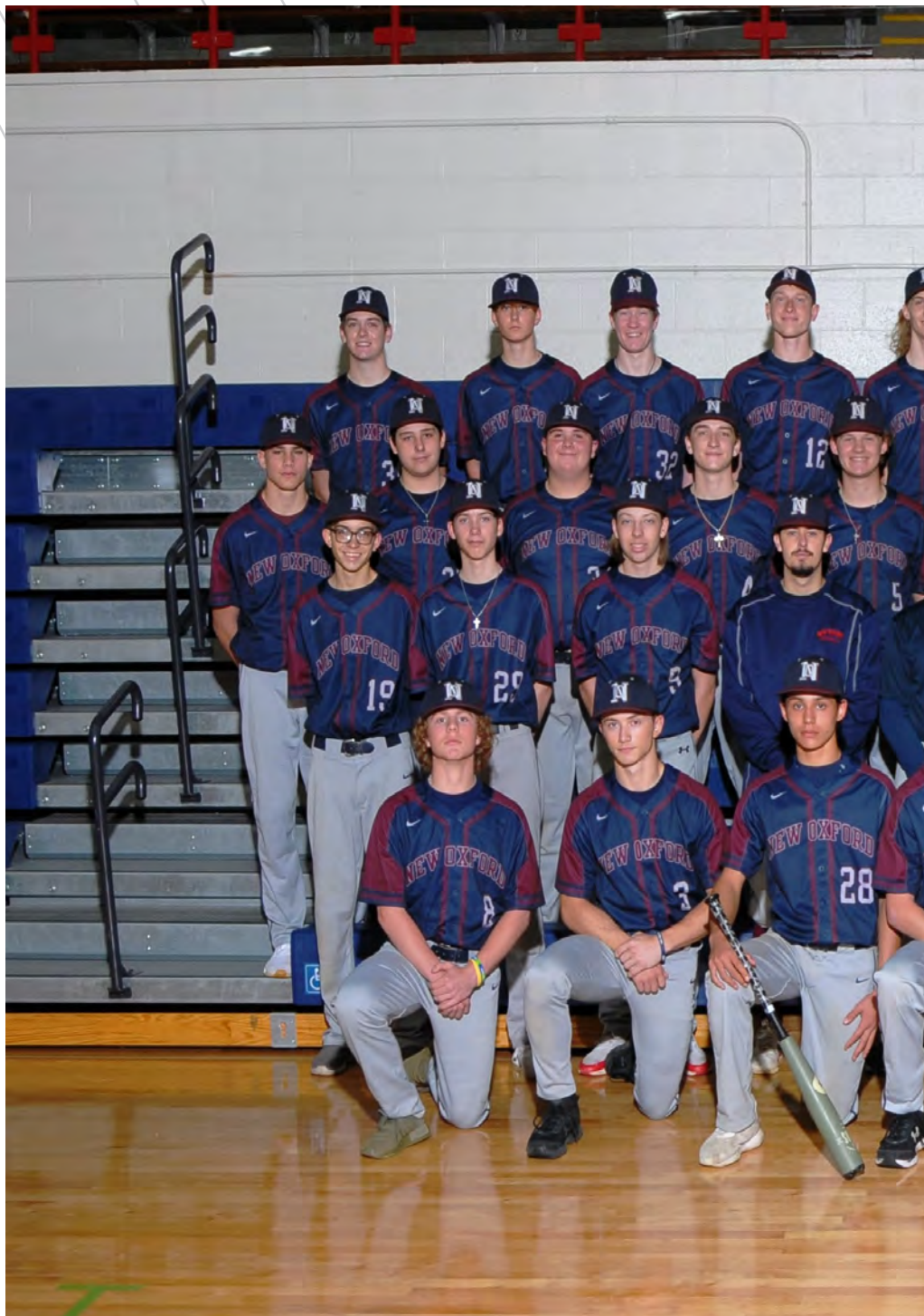

Coach Hall is looking forward to a great year in 2021. Open gyms started in September and numbers have been very high compared to previous years. We are blessed with outstanding student athletes who love the sport and are centered on the team over themselves.

Coach Bio - Vince Hall

Coach Hall graduated from Central High School in Martinsburg, PA.

A 3 year starter, both offense and defense, in football, and team captain his senior year. A 3 year starter in baseball, shortstop, and team captain senior year. (High School was only 10 through 12 at that time) The first running back to exceed 1000 yards rushing in the history of the school and still holds the record for most interceptions in a game. Awarded the VFW Blanket Award, (MVP), was first team both running back and safety in the "Big Eight Conference", (the only unanimous selection). The Dragons won the school's first league championship.

Coach Hall was also selected first team offense and defense in the Center Counties Conference, (covering a 5 county area), awarded the Johnstown Tribune Democrat Player of the Year and was nominated for the "PA Big 33".

His Senior year in baseball was the 8th year in a row the the Dragons won the Blair County League Championship. Led the team in RBI's and hits, and still has the record, with the second & first basemen, for most double plays in one game, (6). Coach Hall was awarded a scholarship to play football at Shippensburg. He averaged over 5 yards per carry there. The Red Raiders won the PSAC championship and went on to the NCAA Division Two Championship Tournament, ranking 3rd in the nation.

He was the head baseball coach at Kennard-Dale while teaching there, awarded "Coach of the Year". While offensive coordinator at Delone Catholic won 3 league titles & 2 PIAA District 3 Championships. Coached football for 2 years at Gettysburg College, 2 years at New Oxford and two years at Susquehannock winning a league championship with an undefeated regular season.

Coach Hall started coaching softball at NOHS in 2003 as a Varsity assistant coach. He resigned in 2011 after his daughter Brooke and her teammates graduated, (he started coaching those girls when they were nine years old the whole way through high school). That team won the YAIAA Division One championship two years in a row, the YAIAA County championship two years in a row, and qualified for districts in '08, '09, '10, and '11. Additionally, they earned the PIAA District 3 silver medal in 2011, and finished top 5 in the state in the top division, (at that time only 4 levels). In 2016, Coach Hall accepted the head coaching position. Since then, the team has qualified for districts in 2017 and 2018, and won the YAIAA Sportsmanship Award in 2017 & 2018.



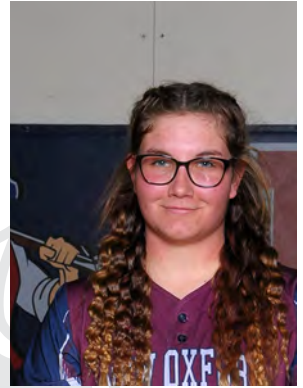

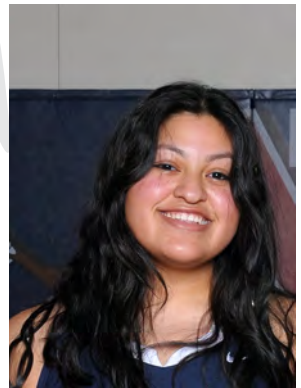

Coach Bio - Travis Martin

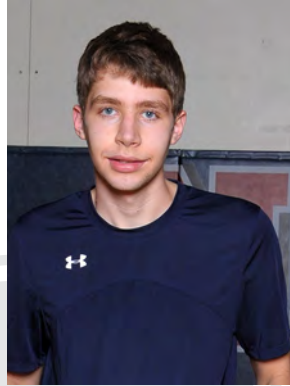
