### Ongoing and Upcoming Projects Scoreboards

The NOABC is working with a 3<sup>rd</sup> party company (Power Ad) to secure new scoreboards for inside the HS gymnasium (including removal of the current scoreboards and the installation of the new ones). The current scoreboards were the class gift of the class of 1989, but unfortunately, many of the replacement and repair parts are now obsolete, therefore making maintenance very difficult. The NOABC would like to thank the class of '89, and we hope this new addition will continue their philanthropy efforts from over 35 years ago!

The projected budget is expected to exceed \$80k, with the NOABC being responsible for over \$20k. The removal of the current scoreboards is scheduled for this summer and the new ones will be installed immediately afterwards in time for the 2025-26 school year. ### If You Know, You Know!

#### How did we become "The Colonials"

Pop quiz hot shot! Select the option that best answers how the colonial became the persona of the CVSD:

- Major Revolution War battle in the New Oxford area
- An anagram for the founder of New Oxford Raphael Locinola (=> COLONIAL)
- A gesture of thanks to a local brick manufacturer
- A public contest

While the battle of Gettysburg did happen less than 15 miles away, this occurred in 1863 during the American Civil War, but when referring to Colonial America, the main conflicts include King Philip's War (1675-1676), French and Indian War (1754-1763), and the American Revolutionary War (1775-1783), to which there is historical evidence that early Americans were in the confines of the New Oxford area (originally referred to as Oxford Town 1792, and not officially decreed New Oxford until 1874 - <a href="https://www.new\_oxford.org/about-new-oxford.html">https://www.new\_oxford.org/about-new-oxford.html</a>), but no military battles occurred in the immediate vicinity, thus this is not the reason behind the name.

Raphael Locinola is a well-known historical figure throughout the early 1800's who did many great things in the New Oxford area, and as a way for the current residents to pay homage to him, the CVSD held a contest for the public to recognize him in a way that only the residents would understand (a hidden meaning, or aka a current "Easter Egg" in superhero movies!). One small 10-year-old boy named John was doing his homework one night, and he was studying Colonial America. His imagination was better than his studying habits, so he would often rearrange letters of words to help him focus his efforts; thus he derived COLONIAL from LOCINOLA. The CVSD loved this so much that they adopted the colonial mascot in Raphael's name and awarded John's family the equivalent of \$2,000 in today's money as a cash prize. It was later understood that anyone who read this article and fell victim to its tall tale, should contact the author as they have "magic beans" to sell as well! Sadly, the part of the public contest portion of the Raphael Locinola story is also false as no such contest was ever conducted here!

So, through the process of elimination, we've arrived here, and you're probably asking yourself, what does a brick have to do with a colonial?



To answer this, you'll need to reference a few external sources. The first is the school's website & history as written in the Conewago Valley School District Brand Standards Guide 2016 (https://www.conewago.k12. pa.us/fs/resource-manager/view/dbf19d85-da59-4828-97d6-6f74562b7ab0 under the District Branding page https://www.conewago.k12.pa.us/community/conewagovalley-school-district-branding). This describes the school's mascot(s) (prior to the offiical creation of the CVSD) being first The Keys and then The Knights before the district adopted The Colonials that stands today. What is missing in the brand standards is who and how the moniker of the Colonial was selected in the first place. To answer this, one must reference a York Daily Record article published in 2017, entitled "What's in a name: The history of YAIAA school nicknames" (https://www.ydr. com/story/sports/2017/08/24/whats-name-history-yaiaaschool-nicknames/569619001/). Within this article, it describes how the Alwine Brick Company (located on current Brickyard Rd. when the company was operational) donated basketball uniforms to the school, and since the Alwine Brick Company manufactured "colonial-style, hand-molded bricks," the CVSD adopted the Colonial as the school district's permanent identity! And if you knew, you knew, but if you didn't, you do now!

#### WE ARE... WHAT?

Many schools have traditions that help form their identity amongst their community and their neighboring schools. For New OXford, one of our enduring traditions is the WE ARE...THE OX! But where did this come from?

In discussion with a football legend in the New Oxford community, former HC and school teacher/administrator Gardy Larwence, the saying is that in the '93 season, the Colonials were battling the Indians of Waynesboro, and while leading in a game at halftime that many outside of the New Oxford team didn't believe could happen, the HC was giving a halftime speech to where he said "They're asking who's this team [New Oxford]? Well let's go out there and let them know who we are. We're...[the following was said in unison by the players without hesitation] The OX" and so the tradition was started. Although it originated with a halftime football speech, it has slowly grown to be a district wide mantra (with the marching band using it as their rally cry as they begin their Friday night routines, to the student section cheering this at the start of each game whether it be football, basketball, etc., and the crowd erupts as one thundering entity when a momentum swinging play happens or a key victory is achieved). This symbolizes what it means to be a Colonial and what the opponents know they're walking into, for Colonial Nation encompasses more than just the players in action at that time, but rather the community and alumni who came before!

And while many others high schools have tried to replicate this, few have sustained it to where it is a part of their identity. And if you knew, you knew, but if you didn't, you do now!
